Have heard of evolutionary science, however, only **37%** say they know a lot or a fair amount about it



71%

Think evolutionary processes can explain how all organisms, including humans, have developed and continue to develop. Only **14%** disagree

65% of those who are religious or spiritual agree that evolutionary processes explain how all organisms, including humans, developed (whilst **19%** disagree)



82% of those who are not religious or spiritual agree that evolutionary processes explain how all organisms, including humans, developed (whilst 5% disagree)







Do **not** find it difficult to accept evolutionary science in reference to their own beliefs. For those who identify as religious or spiritual this is **68%**


Believing in God and evolution

When asked to what extent you think it would be possible to believe in a God or higher power and still hold the view that life on earth, including human life, developed over millions of years as a result of evolutionary processes, **36%** said it would be difficult
